Fire Safety Policy - Easy Read Version

- The Trustees care deeply about everyone's **safety** in the building and want to keep people safe from harm or accidents.
- They follow the **law** and check things regularly like the building's condition, fire alarms, electricity, and gas to make sure it's safe.
- The building belongs entirely to the Centre, and the Trustees look after everything.

Fire Safety & Risk Checks

- Trustees check fire alarms every week and emergency lights every month.
- A professional checks all fire equipment (alarms, extinguishers, lights) once a vear.
- Trustees also carry out **fire risk assessments** and keep them up to date.

If the Fire Alarm Goes Off

- Everyone must leave the building immediately.
- Go to the garden slope or car park meeting point.
- If there's no fire, the alarm will be reset and it's safe to go back in.
- If there is a fire or smell of smoke, leave at once and call 999 or use the BSL 999 app.

Training & Information

- Trained people will know how to check alarms and guide others.
- New users and volunteers will learn fire safety rules.
- Fire drills happen twice a year, and records are kept.

Fire Prevention Rules

- No smoking or vaping inside. There is a smoking area outside.
- No portable cookers or chip pans allowed inside.
- Doors stay locked unless a Trustee is present, to stop intruders or arson.
- Children must always be supervised.

Fire Marshals

- Events must have someone in charge of fire safety.
- They check that **exits are clear**, signs are in place, and equipment is safe.

Evacuation Help

- Only the rear ground floor exit is suitable for wheelchair users.
- Staff and other users should help disabled people in an emergency.
- There are **emergency chairs** on the stairs to help evacuation.

After Evacuation

- Do not return to the building until a Trustee or the Fire Service says it's safe.
- Sign in/out every time so everyone can be accounted for in an emergency.

Building Details

- It's a **three-floor house** with activity rooms, toilets, a kitchen, office, and garden.
- The building can hold up to **60 people**.

Entrance & Hallway

- What could start a fire? Electric sockets, alarm box.
- What could burn? Books, wooden doors, furniture.

Kitchen

- What could start a fire? Gas cooker, tea urn, fridges, microwave.
- What could burn? Wooden units, furniture, cleaning items.
- Extra risk: Kitchen is open to other rooms, fire could spread quickly.

Dining Area

- What could start a fire? Plug sockets.
- What could burn? Furniture.
- Extra risk: Open plan from kitchen.

Lounge

- What could start a fire? TV, plug sockets.
- What could burn? Sofas and chairs.
- Extra risk: Connects to kitchen and dining area.

S Disabled Toilet

- What could start a fire? Light switch.
- What could burn? Wooden items, cleaning products.

Activity Room

- What could start a fire? TV, projector.
- What could burn? Paper, toys, furniture.

Games Room

- What could start a fire? Boiler, sockets, games.
- What could burn? Furniture, craft items.
- Extra risk: Craft cupboard could fuel a fire.

A Church & Vestry

- What could start a fire? Candles, plugs.
- What could burn? Wooden walls, furniture, books.

IT Room & Office

- What could start a fire? Computers, lights, plugs.
- What could burn? Paper, furniture, wood.
- Extra risk: Wooden structure.

Half-Landing Toilets

- What could start a fire? Light fittings.
- What could burn? Wooden cupboard.
- Extra risk: Wooden doors.

People Most at Risk

- Visitors are shown fire exits.
- Workers are told the safety rules.
- **Groups** are given fire instructions.
- **Disabled & elderly people** must be included in evacuation plans.
- Children must be supervised at all times and not allowed upstairs alone.

How to Escape a Fire

- Horizontal: Use front or back doors. Rear door is wheelchair-friendly.
- Vertical: Upstairs flat roof is not safe for escape—use stairs.

Fire Safety Equipment

- Visual and sound alarms are in place.
- Emergency lights are installed.
- Fire extinguishers and a fire blanket are available.

Maintenance and Checks

- Fire alarms, lights, exits and signs checked weekly by Trustees.
- Professional checks every 6 months.
- Fire records are kept near the alarm box.

Fire Service

- Trustees will call 999.
- Deaf users should register phones or use BSL 999 app.

Emergency Plan

- Evacuation plans are on the wall.
- Every group has its own safety plan.
- Training happens once a year.
